Lent: The period of 40 days prior to Easter, beginning with Ash Wednesday. It was originally a time to prepare candidates for baptism and became a period of penitence for those who have been baptized.

Penitence: ("to repent") The condition of being sorrowful and remorseful for sins one has committed.

Have you considered what to give up for Lent this year? Having these definitions in front of us may change our mind in making that decision. Not to point fingers, but who hasn't heard of someone giving up chocolate for Lent? Is giving up chocolate for 40 days really going to bring us into a closer relationship with God? Does God really care that we are willing to stop our indulgences for 40 days only to revert to our previous ways once the Easter Bunny delivers all those chocolate goodies on the day that He is risen? My guess is that God truly desires more.


Imagine what your Lenten journey would look like if you started each day asking God to reveal to you, how your sin interferes with His plan for your life. Better yet, just ask God to reveal a sin that you are blind to, an injustice that you have participated in, a careless act that has caused another to hurt, or even a missed opportunity to love another. As the images come rushing to mind, challenge God to give you the ability to accept, the humble heart to be remorseful, the conviction to want to change and the strength to follow through.


My guess is, a Lenten journey like the one I describe, would bring even the mightiest tower of a person to their knees. Lent isn't about giving something up so that we can feel better about ourselves. Lent is about realizing that God gave up everything for us. I mean really, what could we possibly give up for such a short period of time that would even compare to the priceless gift we have received in Jesus the Christ? Nothing compares to the greatness, mercy and glory given to us by the spilled blood of our Lord and Savior.

If I were to be completely honest, I would find myself more than remorseful for the thoughts, acts, misdeeds and sins in my life. To think that my choices caused the stripes that He took. My disobedience helped pierce His hands. My hardened heart caused a thorny crown to be pushed into His blood- and sweat-matted scalp. The mere thought of my own selfishness makes me nauseated, regretful, remorseful. The more I think about it the more it drives me to the floor, begging for mercy, pleading for forgiveness, desiring a chance to live a transformed life.

May your journey to the Cross this year cultivate a heart that desires more than a temporary turning away from chocolate. May you choose instead to turn toward a lasting, more Christlike way of living. Consider the cost of freedom that you have in Christ. Challenge yourself before the throne of the everlasting God. Commit to a deeper, more meaningful relationship with God.



Firmness of the rock.


