

When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to **childish ways**. 1 Corinthians 13:10-12

Have you ever had a moment where something in your life changed in an instant and you found yourself thinking, "What just happened?" Anthony, our little boy, who's not so little anymore, seems to be growing up way too fast. He is currently at the stage where he is fighting to forge his way into a more mature season of life. How do I know this? Well, I was startled a while back when he uttered a certain word that I just wasn't quite ready for. It was a three-letter word that stopped me in my tracks. It was a word that saddened me, shocked me and even frightened me. What was this three-letter word that shook me to the core? **Dad!** What did he just say? What did he call me? What happened to Daddy?

I must admit, I am really struggling with losing the title of Daddy. I mean seriously, why does this transition happen with boys? Can we just back up a couple of years? Dad, just seems to have such a formal tone to it; Dad doesn't have that same playfulness associated with it like Daddy does. What seems to be a natural transition for Anthony seems to be putting me in a tailspin of emotions contemplating the not so distant



future and the tones associated with **Dad**. Dad, can I borrow the car? **Yes Dad!**

You know the connotations and tones that I am talking about, don't you? The tones that I am talking about are biting and sarcastic, the ones that allude to the sense that children are smarter than their parents. I just don't know if I am ready for this.

Paul writes that when he became a man (or adult), he put away childish things. I just want Paul to answer the WHEN? When did that happen? Paul, tell us how it worked! Let us in on what the transition looked like. Did it happen all at once, or was it gradual? How can we prepare ourselves and live into putting away the childish tendencies we hold on to?

In today's fast paced world, where there is an app for everything, I find myself fighting for the childlike ways that Anthony is wanting to let go of. Yet, therein lies the tension of being a parent; loving and nurturing them well enough for them to be able to grow and mature juxtaposed to wanting them to remain cute, adorable and dependent. My guess is that the real struggle for me is that I just figured out how to be a Daddy and now I am faced with the new responsibility of being a Dad.

Lord, grant me the courage and wisdom to make this transition, I pray.

I think we all face times like these, where we grapple with the reality that we must grow as others around us grow. It literally forces us to put away our own childish ways and grow in to the person God is calling us to be. I wonder if Willoughby UMC can be a safe place where we all can grow and mature together?

May we find comfort in His presence as we embrace the pains of growing up.




