

I once offered a message to a church I was serving, challenging everyone to think about and pray for someone they knew that didn't attend a church. In the message, I quoted some statistics from Pew Life Forum that suggested 4 out of every 5 adults in America have no religious affiliation. In other words, when asked to check the box of religious affiliation they would identify themselves with, 4 out of 5 adults checked off the box marked NONE. Someone from the congregation challenged me on my information, so I went back to the study and printed it out for them. This person just couldn't believe the statistic to be true. So, it begs the question, what if my quote was wrong and the statistic was incorrect? Would it make any difference in the importance of inviting someone to church? Jesus asks the question, "What person among you, if he or she has a hundred **sheep** and has **lost** one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the open pasture and go after the one which is **lost** until he finds it?" (Luke 15:4) Even if I misquoted the findings and the statistic is only 1 out of 5 adults in America have no religious affiliation, Jesus would argue that His disciples would leave the 4 behind and go after the 1.

The heart of the matter is this, every one of us probably knows someone that doesn't come to our church or attend any church for that matter. Jesus has commissioned us to go and make disciples. What are we doing in response? It doesn't take much, a simple invitation to attend a worship service, study in a small group or even attend VBS where they can see the beauty of Christ through the work of the Body. What are we afraid of? Jesus' last words to His disciples were, "Lo I will be with you always, even to the end of the age." We can be courageous in our actions, trusting that Jesus is and will be with us as we invite others to experience Him in church. But what if you are not sure they attend a church? Well, may I suggest you get to know them better.

Today's challenge: Who can I invite to church?

Today's commission: Go therefore and ask!

Today's Prayer: Lord give me the courage to ask and the ability to represent you as I ask.

Go before me Lord and prepare the way. Be with me as I go forth. Amen



Who's Who at WUMC By Pastor Hazel

This month, Pastor Hazel let me take over her column to introduce you to Jean Spangler and Joe Vaidean by Sally Kennedy, Communications Chair

Jean Spangler is our Sunday School Superintendent and has been a member of WUMC for 37 years. Jean is originally from Erie, Pa, but now lives in Mentor-on-the Lake. She has one child, Kimberli, and two grandsons, Brandon and Jimmie. She works at Fredon Corporation. Jean loves cats and has six! Jean also keeps busy with her involvement in Emblem, a service organization associated with the Elks Club.

Jean was raised in the Presbyterian church. Her dad nearly died of a bleeding ulcer and that's when he came to the Lord. The family started attending a Presbyterian church and that's where Jean found the Lord, too. She still associates church with ice cream as her family always followed church with a trip to the ice cream shop. She had a very happy childhood, growing up in the country.

She attended Indiana University of Pennsylvania and obtained a degree in secondary education with a math major. Jean taught for a while and moved around a bit, eventually ending up in Michigan where she started attending Stevensville UMC. A small group there helped her learn to study the Bible and increased her faith. While working at Cook Nuclear Plant in Bridgeman, MI, she met Bob Spangler. Bob was transferred to Wickliffe. They checked out many area churches, but none felt like home until they found WUMC. Kathy Fuller was the first person who welcomed her, and she still has the purple irises that Kathy gave her. Jean says everyone was so friendly they decided to stay. They were members of many small groups and made great friends. Jean also taught Sunday School classes and eventually became Sunday School Superintendent.



Sadly, Bob passed away eight years ago. At the time Jean was going through the Acts Academy with Pat Norris and others who helped her through that difficult period. She says in the time she has been here she has visited other churches, but nowhere else is home.

Joe Vaidean is a relative newcomer to WUMC. Joe first found WUMC during our Lenten activity, Journey to the Cross. He was the first one in the door. He was so moved by the experience that he decided to visit the Good Friday Tennebrae Service. He liked that so he came to a service the next Sunday. Joe says everyone was so friendly, guiding him to a seat and welcoming him. He also joined the Wednesday night Connection Group that meets in the Parlor. He has two sons, Christopher and Jev. His grandparents cleaned a Seventh Day Adventist church and he sometimes went with them. There he could borrow books from the church library - Bibles and Bible story books.

Joe worked at Cleveland Yacht and Supply and Cleveland Yacht Club before he retired. He lived in Mentor until his dad decided to move from California to Willoughby. He found his dad a mobile home and purchased one nearby so he could care for him. When his dad's health deteriorated, he hired a health care provider, Ruthie. She invited Joe to church and one Sunday God called Joe to the altar.
