The excitement of fall; the excitement of small groups!

Then he left the crowds and went into the house. And his disciples approached him, saying, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds of the field." ³⁷ He answered, "The one who sows the good seed is the Son of Man; ³⁸ the field is the world, and the good seed are the children of the kingdom; the weeds are the children of the evil one, ³⁹ and the enemy who sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the end of the age, and the reapers are angels. ⁴⁰ Just as the weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. ⁴¹ The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all causes of sin and all evildoers, ⁴² and they will throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. ⁴³ Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Let anyone with ears listen! (Mat 13:36-43 NRS)

The crowd had heard the words of the creator of the heavens and the earth, yet they walked away no wiser, no more touched, no more transformed than when they arrived. How can I be sure? After the crowds had dispersed the disciples request an explanation of what Jesus just taught. The disciples, those closest to Jesus, those who have heard "ask and it will be given, seek and you shall find," asking for more. They had heard firsthand His teachings on murder, adultery, divorce and love of our enemies. They had witnessed Jesus healing the paralytic, they had witnessed Jesus raising a young girl from the dead, they had even been sent out two by two, to heal the sick and preach the kingdom of heaven was near. All of this to say, that despite all they heard, all they had seen, all they had accomplished, they were left confused at the teaching of this parable. They wanted, no they needed an explanation.

Certainly, if those who had been chosen, those who had heard, witnessed and even performed miracles themselves needed an explanation, think how many among the multitudes left church that day scratching their heads. It's sad to think how many go away from sermons or worship experiences without a word of grace in their hearts. Let those who have ears to listen, listen.....

I think one of the hidden treasures here is the model of small groups, a model that suggest that after corporate worship, we should gather in small groups to discuss what we have heard, to help further understand and even expand on what was presented for the sake of our own benefit. That's exactly what we see the disciples doing with Jesus. Maybe, just maybe, we should model this. If it's good for the twelve that were closest to Jesus, it might just be good for us. Just sayin.....

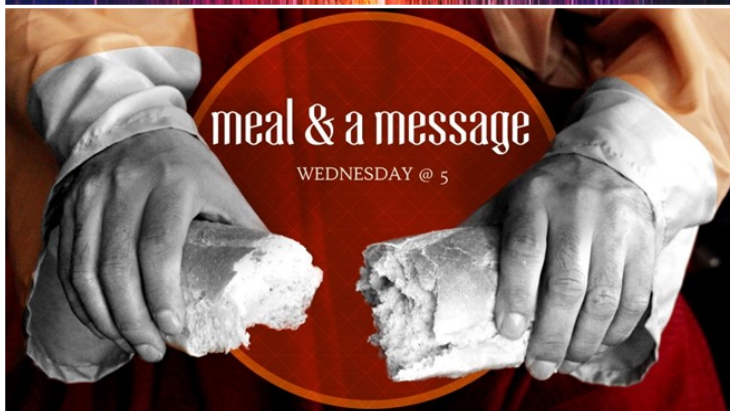
The disciples had heard the words ask and you shall be given, and so they did. Their request to Jesus to explain the parable and His response shows the beauty of God's patience and willingness to teach a humble heart. In fact Psalm 25 puts it this way to those who ask:

Make me to know your ways, O LORD; teach me your paths. Lead me in your truth, and teach me... Good and upright is the LORD; therefore he instructs sinners in the way. He leads the humble in what is right, and teaches the humble his way.

God is willing to take the time to teach us, are we willing to take the time to ask? I invite you, no, I challenge you! Take the time, sign up for a small group this fall and see what God has in store for you. He is knocking at your door, are you willing to open it?

INTERCESSORY PRAYER: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Intercessory prayer is a quiet island of time in the midst of the busy-ness of Wednesday evening here at Willoughby UMC. It is the time when a PRAYER TEAM gathers in the chapel to call on the Lord and to lift up the concerns expressed in prayer requests throughout the week; requests submitted during all four of our worship services, at the community dinner, by visitors to the food pantry, at small group gatherings, and in many other ways. It is also a time when we pray for the various programs, activities, and ministries of our congregation.

What is a prayer team?

A prayer team is a group of individuals who believe prayer is a gift God has given us, his children, because He loves us and wants to walk and talk with us each day, much as He did with Adam and Eve when they lived in the Garden. Prayer team members have committed to set aside a special time each week to pray for the concerns of our congregation.

Who can be on the prayer team?

Everyone who believes in the importance of prayer is invited to join the prayer team.



When and Where Does the Prayer Team Meet?

We meet in the chapel on Wednesday evening at 6:30.

If I can't come on Wednesday evening, can I still be part of the prayer team?

Everyone can join the prayer team. Although we would love to have many people meet with us in the Chapel on Wednesday evening, the only requirement to be part of the prayer team is that you commit to setting aside at least one time each week to pray for Willoughby United Methodist Church. If you can't join us in the chapel on Wednesday evening, just choose a time and place during the week that will work for you. Make that your regular time and place to pray for the needs of our church, our church leaders, and other concerns of your heart.

Who's Who at WUMC By Pastor Hazel



This month we are visiting with Jane and Roy Page. Roy grew up in Eastlake and went to North High. He is in the North High Hall of Fame with his 1960 track team who went to State that year. Jane grew up in Euclid and went to Euclid High. After high school Roy joined the Coast Guard and was involved as a radioman in the Cuban Crisis and Jane went to college at Otterbein. They met on a blind date one January night in 1967 when Jane was teaching. They were engaged in October and married the following June, which means that they have been married for 51 years!

Roy worked for the phone company and retired at age 50 when he had colon cancer. He is now a survivor of 27 years! Because he is so handy he started working as a custodian in an apartment complex.

Jane says he could fix anything – from laying tile to plumbing.

Jane was a Health and PE teacher at Brush High school until she left to be a full time mom. Later she taught at the Cleveland Museum of Health. For 18 years she worked as a Massage and Lymphedema therapist which took her as far away as Austria for her training. For a while she worked for the University Hospitals of Cleveland at their lymphedema clinic. She loved her work with lymphedema patients because it relieved pain and swelling. But most of us know her best for her work at the Y (as swim instructor, life guard, arthritic water exercise classes – pretty much anything that involves water.)

They have two adult daughters, Jennifer and Jessica. Jennifer is a professor in the biology Department at SUNY at Oneonta. Jessica followed in her mom's tracks and is a water therapist for the VA in Cleveland. Each of them have given Roy and Jane 2 boys who keep them busy going to their plays and soccer games and other activities.



They serve the community by delivering Meals on Wheels and have volunteered for hospice – Jane 21 years and Roy 14 years. Jane serves as the President of the Board of Directors of the Women's Welsh Clubs of America. The clubs own the Welsh Home, a rehabilitation, skilled nursing and assisted living facility located in Rocky River. She has been a Girl Scout leader for two troops, and Swim team official. Roy also was a swim team official for the Y and for the Ohio High School Athletic Association.

They serve our church family in many ways, too. They took part in the Rural Mission trips with the Youth to South Carolina for 5 years and were part of the after school program for kids here for about 10 years. Roy has been an usher for at least 30 years and served on the Church Council and the Trustees. Jane is a former Sunday School teacher and is currently reorganizing the Intercessory Prayer group that meets in the Chapel at 6:30 on Wednesday evenings. She invites anyone interested to come to the Meal and a Message service and then join in the prayers after. Of course both of them also help with the Wednesday night meals.

Jane and Roy used to have a trailer home on a private lake in PA. Every weekend (May-October) they spent many hours swimming and boating and enjoying the outdoor life. They also loved taking wind jamming cruises on the Caribbean. Even recently Jane went paddle boarding with her grandsons on their family vacation at Smith Mt. Lake in Virginia! (Brave soul!)

The Pages latest challenge is to learn how to live well with Alzheimer's. Roy received this diagnosis last month. They ask for your patience and your prayers.
